## **The Nicene Creed**

Celebrant Let us confess our faith as we say,

It is indeed right to thank you and praise you, holy and gracious God, creator of all things, ruler of heaven and earth, sustainer of life, for you are the source of all goodness, rich in mercy and abounding in love; you are faithful to your people in every generation, and your word endures for ever. Therefore with angels and

archangels, with the fellowship of saints and the company of heaven, we glorify your holy name, evermore praising you and singing

Holy, holy, holy Lord, Lord God of hosts.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory, hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name, who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest, hosanna in the highest.

On the night he was betrayed, Jesus, at supper with his friends, took bread, gave you thanks, broke the bread, gave it to them, and said, "Take and eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." In obedience to him and with grateful hearts we approach your holy table, remembering our Saviour's sacrifice, and rejoicing in his victory. Confident in his sovereign purpose, we declare our faith,

All Christ has died,
Christ is risen,

Christ will come again.

Celebrant Send your Holy Spirit on us that as we receive this bread and this cup we may partake of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, and feed on him in our hearts by faith with thanksgiving.
