	Betrayed, reviled, and nailed to the cross, he confronted the power of sin and disarmed it for ever. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." In obedience to him and with grateful hearts we approach your holy table, remembering our Saviour's sacrifice, and rejoicing in his victory. Confident in his sovereign purpose, we declare our faith:

- All Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.
