

### The Nicene Creed

Celebrant Let us confess our faith as we say,

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of Heaven and Earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Saviour's sacrifice, and rejoicing in his victory. Confident in his sovereign purpose, we declare our faith.
