Eucharist

All baptized Christians of any denomination are invited to receive the bread and wine. If you are not baptized, or if you would rather not receive communion today, you are invited to come forward for a blessing. Sidespeople will let you know when to come forward. To receive the Eucharist in your seat, please let a sidesperson know and it will be brought to you.

You can:

- + Say nothing – a wafer will be dipped in the wine and placed in your hand
- + Say “common cup” – a wafer will be placed in your hand and then you will be offered the common cup
- + Say “bread only” – a wafer will be placed in your hand
- + If you need a gluten-free wafer, please let us know at the altar
- + If you would like a blessing, cross your arms over your chest

THE GATHERING OF THE COMMUNITY

President: I will bless the Lord at all times,
All: **His praise shall continually be in my mouth.**
President: O magnify the Lord with me,
All: **And let us exalt his name together.**
President: This is the day which the Lord has made,
All: **Let us rejoice and be glad in it.**
President: The Lord is here
All: **His Spirit is with us.**

COLLECT FOR PURITY

All: **Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love You, and worthily magnify Your Holy Name, through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

GLORIA IN EXCELSIS

All **Glory be to God in the highest, and peace to His people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, Almighty God and Father. We worship You, we give You thanks, we praise You for Your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, You take away the sin of the world, have mercy on us. You are seated at the right hand of the Father; receive our prayer. For You alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord. You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

SUMMARY OF THE LAW

President: Our Lord Jesus Christ said: 'Hear O Israel, the Lord our God is one Lord, and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this: You shall love your neighbour as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.

All: **Lord, have mercy upon us, and write all these laws in our hearts.**

President: God so loved the world that He gave His only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our Advocate in heaven and to bring us to eternal life.

A Brief Pause:

President: Let us confess our sins, in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all people, meekly kneeling and saying:

All: **Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against You and against our neighbours, in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We have not sufficiently walked according to the mind of Christ. We have named the name of Christ, but have not departed from iniquity. We are truly sorry, and repent of all our sins. For the sake of Your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past, and grant that we may serve You in newness of life, to the glory of Your name. Amen.**

President: Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in life eternal, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: **Amen.**

President: The Lord be with you

All: **And also with you**

NICENE CREED

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is seen and unseen.

We believe one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of
the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God,
begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through Him all things
were made. For us men and for our salvation, He came down from heaven;
by the power of the Holy Spirit, He became incarnate of the Virgin Mary and
was made man. For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate: He
suffered death and was buried. On the third day, He rose again in

accordance with the scriptures; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, He will come again in glory, to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son, He is worshipped and glorified; He has spoken through the prophets. OFFERTORY HYMN: Thou, Who at Thy First Eucharist

President: Blessed are You, Lord God of all creation, through Your goodness we have this bread to offer which the earth has given, and human hands have made. It will become for us the Bread of Life.

All: **Blessed be God forever. Amen.**

President: Blessed are You, Lord God of all creation, through Your goodness we have this wine to offer, fruit of the vine and work of human hands. It will become our spiritual drink.

All: **Blessed be God forever. Amen.**

All: **Yours Lord, is the greatness, the power, the glory, the splendor, and the majesty; for everything in heaven and on earth is Yours. All things come from you and of Your own do we give You.**

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYERS

President: The Lord be with you.

All: **And also with you.**

President: Lift up your hearts.

All: **We lift them to the Lord.**

President: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: **It is right to give Him thanks and praise.**

President: It is indeed right; it is our duty and joy at all times and in all places to give You thanks and praise Holy Father, Heavenly King, Almighty and Eternal God through Jesus Christ Your only Son our Lord, for He is Your living Word; through Him You have created all things from the beginning, and formed us in Your own image.

Through Him You have freed us from the slavery of sin, giving Him to be born as man and to die upon the cross; You raised Him from the dead and exalted Him to Your right hand on high. Through Him You have sent upon us Your Holy and life-giving Spirit, and made us a people for Your own possession.

Therefore, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim Your great and glorious name, forever praising You and saying:

All: **Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory,
hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest.**

(The congregation may kneel, the President continues)

President: Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through Your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow His example and obey His command, grant that by the power of Your Holy Spirit, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us, His Body and Blood; Who in the same night that He was betrayed, took bread and gave You thanks;

He broke it and gave it to His disciples saying: "Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me". In the same way, after supper, He took the cup and gave You thanks, he gave it to them, saying: "Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me".

All: Therefore, we proclaim the ministry of faith
**Christ has died,
Christ is risen;
Christ will come again.**

President: Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember His offering of Himself made once for all upon the cross; and proclaim His mighty resurrection and glorious ascension. As we look for His coming in glory, we celebrate with this bread and this cup His one perfect sacrifice.

Accept through Him, our great High Priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of Your divine Majesty, renew us by Your Spirit, inspire us with Your love, and unite us in the body of Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through Him, and with Him, and in Him, by the power of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before You in earth and heaven, we worship You, Father Almighty in songs of everlasting praise.

All: **Blessing and honour and glory and power be Yours forever and ever. Amen.**

President: We break this bread to share in the Body of Christ.

All: **Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one Bread.**

President: Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world.

All: **Have mercy on us.**

PRAYER OF HUMBLE ACCESS *(All Kneeling)*

All: We do not presume to come to Your table, merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness but in Your manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under Your table. But You are the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of Your Dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink His Blood, that we may evermore dwell in Him and He in us. Amen.

President: Draw near with faith, receive the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ which He gave you, and His Blood which He shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that He died for you and feed on Him in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.
